Half Moon is considered to be one of the world's finest resorts.

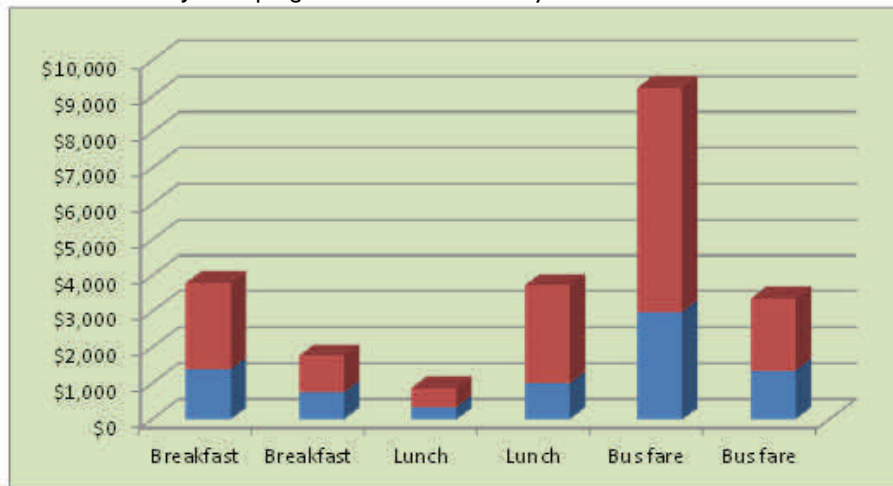

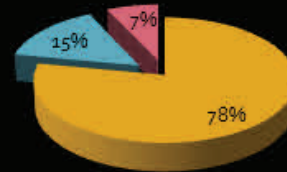

2011-2012 Expenses



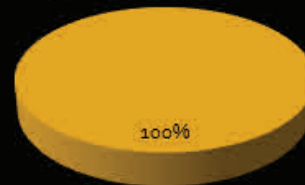
