
Your Impact Through Jamaica YES

The number of Basic (Pre-K) and Primary (Elementary) schools reaching out to us for assistance has increased from last year due to higher unemployment, reduced household income and rampant inflation resulting in a greater number of students in need.

2023 SCHOOL PROJECTS

Belfield Primary School - St Mary Parish

In 2022, after several years of attempting to establish a computer room at Belfield Primary, Agency Owners from Globe Life Liberty National Division donated their personal funds to make the dream a reality. In May 2023, the new technology center was dedicated before an audience that included students, teachers, parents, honored alumni and representatives from the Ministry of Education and Youth. Several of the students have never had the opportunity to even turn on a computer and now, due to the generosity of over 80 Globe Life donors living in the U.S. they will be well prepared to enter the next phase of their education.

<u> Ewarton Basic School – St Catherine Parish</u>

In 2023, Fred & Cynthia Pennekamp, long time visitors of Jamaica (and big supporters of Jamaica YES), established the Donald (Danny) Pantry Memorial Fund. As mentioned on the first page of this newsletter Danny was a huge factor in sharing information about Jamaica YES and the plight of the underserved school children of Jamaica with potential donors. He was also an alumni of Ewarton Basic School. In his memory, the Pennekamp's and several of Danny's friends are now financing a three phase project at Ewarton Basic that includes the eradication of severe termite infestation at the school (completed), rehabilitating a partially framed structure (in progress) to provide increased classroom space to accommodate a significant increase in student enrollment due in part to the implementation of the Jamaica YES breakfast program and rebuilding the ceiling/roof over the kitchen and children's restroom area due to extensive termite damage (final phase).
